SUBJECT: Screening levels for Heptachlor

The cancer risk-based screening levels for heptachlor were established on 11/30/94. They are as follows:

IRSL = 0.0008  $\mu$ g/m<sup>3</sup>, annual averaging time; SRSL = 0.008  $\mu$ g/m<sup>3</sup>, annual averaging time.

EPA (1993) concluded that heptachlor is classified as, "B2; probable human carcinogen" based on inadequate human data and sufficient evidence of carcinogenicity in animals, namely an increased incidence of benign and malignant liver tumors after oral (dietary) administration of heptachlor in mice. EPA (1993) provided an inhalation unit risk estimate of 1.3E-3 per ug/m<sup>3</sup>, calculated from the oral bioassat data. Based on this unit risk estimate (URE), the IRSL and SRSL are derived as follows:

IRSL =  $\frac{1E-6}{1.3E-3 (\mu g/m^3)^{-1}}$  = 0.0008 µg/m<sup>3</sup> (annual AT)

SRSL =  $\frac{1E-5}{1.3E-3 (\mu g/m^3)^{-1}}$  = 0.008 µg/m<sup>3</sup> (annual AT)
