On July 22, 2021, I, AQD staff Joseph Forth conducted scheduled inspection of Toggled located at 164 Indusco Court, Troy, MI. The purpose of this inspection was to determine the facility's compliance with the Federal Clean Air Act Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act of 1994, PA 451, as amended, and Michigan's Air Pollution Control Rules.

Upon contacting Toggled representative Dan Hollenkamp to set up the inspection, Mr. Hollenkamp explained that Toggled no longer occupies their former production site at 164 Indusco Court. That space is currently occupied by Pantero, Inc. a shipping products company. Mr. Hollenkamp provided me with Pantero Principal, John Reid's contact information. Mr. Reid met with me, I showed him my credentials and stated the purpose of the inspection. Mr. Reid showed me the space that used to be occupied by Toggled. From my inspection of the location, I did not see any of the equipment mentioned from the previous inspection of Toggled, nor did it appear that Pantero had any equipment that could potentially emit any air contaminants. The space that Pantero occupies is mostly for storage and auto detailing (cleaning, waxing, polishing). I thanked Mr. Reid for his time and left the facility.

Pantero appears to be in compliance with all air pollution rules. I will request that the SRN P0409 belonging to Toggled be changed to Pantero and have marked it as Only Exempt Equipment.
