Pursuant to Air Pollution Control Rule 336.1201(1), this permit constitutes the permittee's authority to install the identified emission unit(s) in accordance with all administrative rules of the Department and the attached conditions. Operation of the emission unit(s) identified in this Permit to Install is allowed pursuant to Rule 336.1201(6).

* For High Volume Low Pressure (HVLP) applicators, the pressure measured at the HVLP gun air cap shall not exceed ten (10) pounds per square inch gauge (psig).

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))
- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909-7760, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to R 336.1210, operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The terms and conditions of this Permit to Install shall apply to any person or legal entity that now or hereafter owns or operates the process or process equipment at the location authorized by this Permit to Install. If the new owner or operator submits a written request to the Department pursuant to R 336.1219 and the Department approves the request, this permit will be amended to reflect the change of ownership or operational control. The request must include all of the information required by subrules (1)(a), (b), and (c) of R 336.1219 and shall be sent to the District Supervisor, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). (R 336.1912)
- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law.
- 10. Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.

- 11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of R 336.1301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with R 336.1303. (R 336.1301)
 - a) A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
 - b) A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
 - c) A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this Permit to Install.
- Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in R 336.1370(2). (R 336.1370)
- 13. The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with R 336.2001 and R 336.2003, under any of the conditions listed in R 336.2001. (R 336.2001)

III. PROCESS/OPERATIONAL RESTRICTIONS

- 1. The permittee shall maintain the liquid flow rate and pressure drop for each wet scrubber as specified in the operation and maintenance plan. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- 2. The permittee shall limit the air flow rate to scrubber #PR1079 (the existing scrubber) to 700 acfm or less. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- Within 30 calendar days of the date of permit approval, the permittee shall submit to the AQD District Supervisor, an approvable operation and maintenance plan for the wet scrubbers. (R 336.1225, R 336.1910)

IV. DESIGN/EQUIPMENT PARAMETERS

- The permittee shall not operate EUACET unless at least one of the wet scrubbers associated with EUACET is installed, maintained, and operated as specified in the operation and maintenance plan. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- The permittee shall equip and maintain each wet scrubber associated with EUACET with a liquid flow indicator and a gauge which measures the pressure drop across the scrubber tower. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- 3. The permittee shall equip and maintain scrubber #PR1079 (the existing scrubber) associated with EUACET with an air flow rate indicator. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)

V. TESTING/SAMPLING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

VI. MONITORING/RECORDKEEPING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

- The permittee shall monitor, in a satisfactory manner, the liquid flow rate and the pressure drop for each wet scrubber associated with EUACET on a continuous basis when at least one of the acetators is operating. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- The permittee shall record, in a satisfactory manner, at least once per calendar day, when at least one of the acetators is operating, the liquid flow rate and pressure drop for each wet scrubber associated with EUACET. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- The permittee shall monitor, in a satisfactory manner, the air flow rate of scrubber #PR1079 (the existing scrubber) associated with EUACET on a continuous basis when scrubber #PR1079 is operating. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- 4. The permittee shall record, in a satisfactory manner, at least once per hour, when scrubber #PR1079 is operating, the air flow rate of scrubber #PR1079 (the existing scrubber) associated with EUACET. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, monthly records of the number of batches produced per tank. Each "mash" addition through discharge shall be considered one batch. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 6. The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, monthly and 12-month rolling time period calculations of VOC emission rates for EUACET. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 7. The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, monthly records of the dates and times that scrubber #PR1079 was operating. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)

VII. <u>REPORTING</u>

1. Within 14 days after completion of the installation of the new acetator authorized by this Permit to Install, the permittee or the authorized agent pursuant to Rule 204, shall notify the AQD District Supervisor, in writing, of the completion of the activity. Completion of the installation of the new acetator is considered to occur not later than commencement of trial operation of the new acetator. (R 336.1201(7)(a))

VIII. STACK/VENT RESTRICTIONS

The exhaust gases from the stacks listed in the table below shall be discharged unobstructed vertically upwards to the ambient air unless otherwise noted:
