GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))
- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to R 336.1210, operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The AQD District Supervisor shall be notified, in writing, of a change in ownership or operational control of the stationary source or emission unit(s) authorized by this Permit to Install pursuant to R 336.1219. The notification shall include all of the information required by R 336.1219(1)(a) and (b). In addition, a new owner or operator must submit a written statement pursuant to R 336.1219(1)(c), agreeing to and accepting the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install, and shall notify the AQD District Supervisor of any change in the contact person for this Permit to Install. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal conditions or malfunction has been corrected, or within 30 days of discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). (R 336.1912)

- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law nor does it affect any liability for past violations under the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451.
- 10. Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.
- 11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of R 336.1301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with R 336.1303. (R 336.1301)
 - a) A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
 - b) A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
 - c) A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this permit to install.
- 12. Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in R 336.1370(2). (R 336.1370)
- 13. The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with R 336.2001 and R 336.2003, under any of the conditions listed in R 336.2001. (R 336.2001)

Process / Ope rational Limits

- 1.2 No later than 60 days after issuance of this permit, the permittee shall submit to the AQD District Supervisor, for review and approval, a preventative maintenance / malfunction abatement plan (PM / MAP) for EUENGINE1. After approval of the PM / MAP by the AQD District Supervisor, the permittee shall not operate EUENGINE1 unless the PM / MAP, or an alternate plan approved by the AQD District Supervisor, is implemented and maintained. The plan shall incorporate procedures recommended by the equipment manufacturer as well as incorporating standard industry practices. At a minimum the plan shall include:
 - a. Identification of the equipment and, if applicable, air-cleaning device and the supervisory personnel responsible for overseeing the inspection, maintenance, and repair
 - b. Description of the items or conditions to be inspected and frequency of the inspections or repairs
 - c. Identification of the equipment and, if applicable, air-cleaning device, operating parameters that shall be monitored to detect a malfunction or failure, the normal operating range of these parameters and a description of the method of monitoring or surveillance procedures
 - d. Identification of the major replacement parts that shall be maintained in inventory for quick replacement
 - e. A description of the corrective procedures or operational changes that shall be taken in the event of a malfunction or failure to achieve compliance with the applicable emission limits

If the plan fails to address or inadequately addresses an event that meets the characteristics of a malfunction at the time the plan is initially developed, the owner or operator shall revise the plan within 45 days after such an event occurs and submit the revised plan for approval to the AQD District Supervisor. Should the AQD determine the PM / MAP to be inadequate, the AQD District Supervisor may request modification of the plan to address those inadequacies. (R 336.1205, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910, R 336.1911, R 336.1912)

- 1.3 The permittee shall not operate any engine equipped with an add-on control device for more than 200 hours per engine per year without that control device consistent with the PM / MAP (pursuant to SC 1.2). The 200 hours shall include times after an engine change-out occurs and general maintenance performed as allowed by the PM / MAP. The hours per year limit is based on a 12-month rolling time period as determined at the end of each calendar month. (R 336.1205, R 336.1702(a))
- 1.4 The natural gas usage for EUENGINE1 shall not exceed 48,040,050 cubic feet per year. (R 336.1205)

Equipment

1.5 The permittee shall not operate any engine that contains an add-on control device unless that device is installed, maintained, and operated in a satisfactory manner, except as specified in SC 1.3. Satisfactory operation includes performing the manufacturer's recommended maintenance on the control device and operating in conjunction with the PM / MAP specified in SC 1.2. (R 336.1205, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)

Testina

1.6 Upon request by the AQD District Supervisor, the permittee shall verify NO_x and CO emission factors used to calculate emissions from EUENGINE1, by testing at owner's expense, in accordance with Department requirements. If a test has been conducted, any resulting increase in an emission factor shall be implemented to calculate NO_x and CO. No less than 60 days prior to testing, the permittee shall submit a complete test plan to the AQD. The AQD must approve the final plan prior to testing. Verification of emission rates includes the submittal of a complete report of the test results to the AQD within 60 days following the last date of the test. (R 336.1205, R 336.2001, R 336.2003, R 336.2004)

Monitoring

1.7 The permittee shall install, calibrate, maintain and operate in a satisfactory manner a device to monitor and record the natural gas usage for EUENGINE1 on a continuous basis. (R 336.1205)

Recordkeeping / Reporting / Notification

- 1.8 The permittee shall complete all required calculations in a format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor and make them available by the 15th day of the calendar month, for the previous calendar month, unless otherwise specified in any recordkeeping, reporting or notification special condition. (R 336.1205, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1901)
- 1.9 The permittee shall maintain a log of all maintenance activities conducted according to the PM / MAP (pursuant to SC 1.2). The permittee shall keep this log on file at the facility for a period of at least five years and make it available to the Department upon request. Except as provided in R 336.1285, if the engine is replaced with an equivalent-emitting or lower-emitting engine, the

permittee shall notify the AQD District Supervisor of such change-out and submit acceptable emissions data to show that the alternate engine is equivalent-emitting or lower-emitting. (R 336.1205, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1911)

- 1.10 The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, for any engine equipped with an add-on control device, monthly and 12-month rolling time period records of the hours that the engine is operated without the control device. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility for a period of at least five years and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205, R 336.1702(a))
- 1.11 The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, monthly fuel use records for EUENGINE1, as required by SC 1.7. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility for a period of at least five years and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205)
- 1.12 The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, monthly and 12-month rolling time period NO_x emission calculation records for EUENGINE1, as required by SC 1.1 and Appendix A. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility for a period of at least five years and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205)

Material Limits

2.2 Except for emergency flaring of sour gas, the permittee shall only burn sweet natural gas in FGFACILITY. (R 336.1205(3))

Process / Operational Limits

2.3 The permittee shall operate a continuously burning sweet gas pilot flame at the flare while any equipment at FGFACILITY is processing natural gas. In the event that the pilot flame is extinguished, the permittee shall attempt to re-light the pilot flame. If the pilot flame is not re-lit within two hours, the permittee shall stop processing natural gas in equipment at FGFACILITY until the pilot flame is re-lit and maintained. (R 336.1224, R 336.1702, R 336.1901, R 336.1910)

Recordkeeping / Reporting / Notification

- 2.4 The permittee shall complete all required calculations in a format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor and make them available by the 15th day of the calendar month, for the previous calendar month, unless otherwise specified in any recordkeeping, reporting or notification special condition. (R 336.1205(3))
- 2.5 The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, monthly and 12-month rolling time period NOx emission calculation records for FGFACILITY, as required by SC 2.1 and Appendix A. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility for a period of at least five years and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
- 2.6 The permittee shall record the time and duration of each incidence of emergency flaring of sour gas. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility for a period of five years and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1901, R 336.1910, R 336.1911)

APPENDIX A Procedures for Calculating NOx Emissions

The permittee shall demonstrate compliance with the NOx emission limits by keeping track of all fuel usage for all equipment using such fuel at this facility and multiplying that fuel usage by an equipment-specific emission factor. The emission factors are typically expressed as the mass of pollutant per unit of fuel.

EUENGINE1:

The permittee shall use emission factors from vendor data or from source specific testing (stack testing), as available for EUENGINE1. This also applies to engine(s) from engine change-out(s). If emission factors from other sources are used, the permittee shall obtain the approval of the AQD District Supervisor before using the emission factors to calculate emissions.

Fuel burning equipment at the facility:

The permittee shall use emission factors contained in the most recent AP-42 (Compilation of Air Pollutant Emission Factors) or the most recent FIRE (Factor Information Retrieval) database if vendor or stack testing data is not available. If emission factors from other sources are used, the permittee shall obtain the approval of the AQD District Supervisor before using the emission factors to calculate emissions.

The permittee shall document the source of each emission factor used in the calculations.
