GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))
- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909-7760, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to R 336.1210, operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The terms and conditions of this Permit to Install shall apply to any person or legal entity that now or hereafter owns or operates the process or process equipment at the location authorized by this Permit to Install. If the new owner or operator submits a written request to the Department pursuant to R 336.1219 and the Department approves the request, this permit will be amended to reflect the change of ownership or operational control. The request must include all of the information required by subrules (1)(a), (b), and (c) of R 336.1219 and shall be sent to the District Supervisor, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal conditions or malfunction has been corrected, or within 30 days of discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). **(R 336.1912)**
- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law.
- 10. Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.

- 11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of R 336.1301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with R 336.1303. (R 336.1301)
 - a) A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
 - b) A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
 - c) A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this Permit to Install.
- Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in R 336.1370(2). (R 336.1370)
- 13. The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with R 336.2001 and R 336.2003, under any of the conditions listed in R 336.2001. (R 336.2001)

II. MATERIAL LIMITS

- 1. The permittee shall not dry more than 65,000 tons of aggregate in the Drying System per 12-month rolling time period as determined at the end of each calendar month. (R 336.1205(3))
- 2. The permittee shall not process more than 30,000 tons of rock salt in the rock salt line per 12-month rolling time period as determined at the end of each calendar month. (R 336.1205(3))

III. PROCESS/OPERATIONAL RESTRICTIONS

1. The permittee shall inspect all roadways and parking areas at least once each calendar day and sweep as needed to minimize fugitive dust emissions. (R 336.1205(3))

IV. DESIGN/EQUIPMENT PARAMETERS

- 1. The permittee shall not operate the Drying System unless the fabric filter dust collector is installed, maintained, and operated in a manner acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. Acceptable operation includes maintaining the pressure drop in the range specified by the manufacturer or an alternate range acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. (R 336.1205(3))
- 2. The permittee shall not operate the concrete batching/packaging unless the cartridge filter dust collector is installed, maintained, and operated in a manner acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. Acceptable operation includes maintaining the pressure drop in the range specified by the manufacturer or an alternate range acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. (R 336.1205(3))
- 3. The permittee shall not operate any cement storage bin unless the associated fabric filter is installed, maintained, and operated in a manner acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. (R 336.1205(3))
- 4. The permittee shall equip and maintain the fabric filter dust collector with a differential pressure monitoring device. (R 336.1205(3))

5. The permittee shall equip and maintain the cartridge filter dust collector with a differential pressure monitoring device. (R 336.1205(3))

V. TESTING/SAMPLING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

VI. MONITORING/RECORDKEEPING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

- 1. The permittee shall complete all required calculations in a format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor by the last day of the calendar month, for the previous calendar month, unless otherwise specified in any recordkeeping, reporting or notification special condition. (**R 336.1205(3)**)
- 2. The permittee shall monitor and record, at least once per calendar day, the differential pressure of the fabric filter dust collector and the cartridge filter dust collector. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
- 3. The permittee shall inspect the fabric filter dust collector, the cartridge filter dust collector, and each cement storage bin fabric filter on a monthly basis. (R 336.1205(3))
- The permittee shall keep, in a manner acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor, records of the monthly dust collector and fabric filter inspections required by SC VI.3 and any repairs made to the dust collectors. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
- 5. The permittee shall keep monthly records of the roadway and parking area inspections, as required by SC III.1. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
- 6. The permittee shall keep, in a manner acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor, monthly and 12-month rolling time period, as determined at the end of each calendar month, records of the tons of aggregate dried in the Drying System and the hours of operation of the Drying System. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
- 7. The permittee shall keep, in a manner acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor, monthly and 12-month rolling time period, as determined at the end of each calendar month, records of the tons of raw material cement purchased. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
- 8. The permittee shall keep, in a manner acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor, monthly and 12-month rolling time period, as determined at the end of each calendar month, records of the tons of rock salt processed. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
- 9. The permittee shall calculate the PM, PM10, PM2.5, and VOC emission rates from FGFACILITY monthly, for the preceding 12-month rolling time period, using the tons of aggregate dried, the hours of operation of the Drying System, amount of cement purchased, the amount of rock salt processed, and appropriate emission factors or another method acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205(3))
