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#### **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

1. The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))

- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909-7760, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to R 336.1210, operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The terms and conditions of this Permit to Install shall apply to any person or legal entity that now or hereafter owns or operates the process or process equipment at the location authorized by this Permit to Install. If the new owner or operator submits a written request to the Department pursuant to R 336.1219 and the Department approves the request, this permit will be amended to reflect the change of ownership or operational control. The request must include all of the information required by subrules (1)(a), (b), and (c) of R 336.1219 and shall be sent to the District Supervisor, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal conditions or malfunction has been corrected, or within 30 days of discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). (R 336.1912)
- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law.
- 10. Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.

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11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of R 336.1301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with R 336.1303. (R 336.1301)

- a. A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
- b. A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
- c. A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this Permit to Install.
- 12. Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in R 336.1370(2). (R 336.1370)
- 13. The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with R 336.2001 and R 336.2003, under any of the conditions listed in R 336.2001. (R 336.2001)

**<u>DESCRIPTION</u>**: A batch type natural gas-fired burnoff oven with a secondary chamber or afterburner, used to remove cured paints, oil or grease from metal parts by thermal decomposition in a primary chamber. The primary and secondary chambers are each rated at 1.0 MMBTU/hr.

**POLLUTION CONTROL EQUIPMENT:** Secondary chamber (afterburner)

#### I. <u>EMISSION LIMITS</u>

1. There shall be no visible emissions from EU-BOVEN. (R 336.1301)

#### II. MATERIAL LIMITS

1. The permittee shall burn only natural gas in EU-BOVEN. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1702, 40 CFR 52.21(c) & (d))

#### **III. PROCESS/OPERATIONAL RESTRICTIONS**

- 1. The permittee shall not use EU-BOVEN for the thermal destruction or removal of uncured paints or any materials containing non-chlorine halogens (fluorine, bromine, etc.), such as Teflon. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)
- 2. The permittee shall not load any transformer cores, which may be contaminated with PCB-containing dielectric fluid, wire or parts coated with lead, or any waste materials such as paint sludge or waste powder coatings into EU-BOVEN. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)

#### IV. DESIGN/EQUIPMENT PARAMETERS

- 1. The permittee shall not operate EU-BOVEN unless a secondary chamber or afterburner is installed, maintained, and operated in a satisfactory manner. Satisfactory operation of the secondary chamber or afterburner includes maintaining a minimum temperature of 1400°F and a minimum retention time of 0.5 seconds. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 2. The permittee shall not operate EU-BOVEN unless an automatic temperature control system for the primary chamber and secondary chamber or afterburner is installed, maintained, and operated in a satisfactory manner. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 3. The permittee shall not operate EU-BOVEN unless an interlock system that shuts down the primary chamber burner when the secondary chamber or afterburner is not operating properly, is installed, maintained and operated in a satisfactory manner. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)

#### V. TESTING/SAMPLING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

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#### VI. MONITORING/RECORDKEEPING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

1. The permittee shall install, calibrate, maintain and operate in a satisfactory manner a device to continuously monitor the temperature in the burn-off oven secondary chamber or afterburner for EU-BOVEN and record the temperature at least once every 15 minutes. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)

- 2. The permittee shall calibrate the temperature signal received by the controller associated with the primary and secondary chambers of EU-BOVEN at least once per year, and keep records of the calibrations. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1201(3), R 336.1224, R 336.1225)
- 3. The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, temperature data records for the burn-off oven secondary chamber or afterburner for EU-BOVEN. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 4. The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, records of the date, duration, and description of any malfunction of the control equipment, any maintenance performed and any testing results for EU-BOVEN. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1910, R 336.1912)
- 5. The permittee shall maintain a current listing from the manufacturer of the chemical composition of each material processed in EU-BOVEN, including the weight percent of each component. The data may consist of Material Safety Data Sheets, manufacturer's formulation data, or both. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)
- 6. The permittee shall maintain current information from the manufacturer that EU-BOVEN is equipped with a secondary chamber or afterburner, an automatic temperature control system for the primary chamber and secondary chamber or afterburner, and an interlock system that shuts down the primary chamber burner when the secondary chamber or afterburner is not operating properly. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)
- 7. The permittee shall monitor EU-BOVEN to verify proper operation by taking visible emission (VE) readings once per calendar month. For VE readings, the permittee shall observe the stack exhaust during EU-BOVEN operation and recording whether or not visible emissions are present every fifteen (15) seconds for a duration of six (6) minutes. The permittee may reduce the frequency of VE readings to once per every six calendar months if no visible emissions (other than uncombined water vapor) are observed for three (3) consecutive months when performing monthly VE readings. Either a certified or non-certified reader shall take each VE reading during routine operating conditions. If any visible emissions (other than uncombined water vapor) are observed, the permittee shall immediately inspect the oven, verify the type of coating that is being processed, perform any required maintenance on the oven, and return to conducting VE readings on a monthly basis for a minimum of three (3) months. The permittee shall keep records of any action taken in response to readings of visible emissions (other than uncombined water vapor). The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 8. The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, records of all visible emission readings for EU-BOVEN. At a minimum, records shall include the date, time, name of observer/reader, whether the reader is certified, and status of visible emissions during the observation period. The permittee shall keep all records on file and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1301, R 336.1910)

1. The permittee shall install and operate in a satisfactory manner the afterburner temperature recording device, as referenced in SC VI.1, and the interlock system, as referenced in SC VI.6, on EU-BOVEN within 14 days of the date of issuance of this PTI. (R 336.1910)
