## **GENERAL CONDITIONS**

- 1. The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))
- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909-7760, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to R 336.1210, operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The terms and conditions of this Permit to Install shall apply to any person or legal entity that now or hereafter owns or operates the process or process equipment at the location authorized by this Permit to Install. If the new owner or operator submits a written request to the Department pursuant to R 336.1219 and the Department approves the request, this permit will be amended to reflect the change of ownership or operational control. The request must include all of the information required by subrules (1)(a), (b), and (c) of R 336.1219 and shall be sent to the District Supervisor, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal conditions or malfunction has been corrected, or within 30 days of discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). **(R 336.1912)**
- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law.
- 10. Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.

- 11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of R 336.1301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with R 336.1303. (R 336.1301)
  - a) A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
  - b) A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
  - c) A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this Permit to Install.
- Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in R 336.1370(2). (R 336.1370)
- The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with R 336.2001 and R 336.2003, under any of the conditions listed in R 336.2001. (R 336.2001)

## The following conditions apply to: FG-PLANT

**DESCRIPTION:** A CMI Johnson Ross enclosed concrete batch plant with a covered material conveyor, weightbatcher, material bins, cement silos, telescoping discharge chute, and a cartridge pulse central dust collector as well as fugitive dust sources including plant roadways, plant yard, material storage piles, and material handling operations.

Emission Units: EU-BATCHPLANT, EU-YARD.

**POLLUTION CONTROL EQUIPMENT:** Cartridge pulse dust collector.

## I. EMISSION LIMITS

- 1. Visible emissions from the cartridge pulse dust collector shall not exceed a six-minute average of 5 percent opacity. (R 336.1301, 40 CFR 52.21(c) & (d))
- 2. Visible emissions from the drop point and transfer point portions of FG-PLANT shall not exceed 10 percent opacity. (R 336.1301, 40 CFR 52.21(c) & (d))
- 3. Visible emissions from all wheel loaders and all truck traffic operated in conjunction with FG-PLANT shall not exceed 5 percent opacity. (R 336.1301, 40 CFR 52.21(c) & (d))
- 4. Visible emissions from all material storage piles operated in conjunction with FG-PLANT shall not exceed 5 percent opacity. (R 336.1301, 40 CFR 52.21(c) & (d))

### II. MATERIAL LIMITS

1. The permittee shall not produce more than 200,000 cubic yards of concrete per 12-month rolling time period as determined at the end of each calendar month. (40 CFR 52.21 (c) & (d))

#### III. PROCESS/OPERATIONAL RESTRICTIONS

1. The permittee shall not operate FG-PLANT unless the nuisance minimization plan for fugitive dust for all plant roadways, the plant yard, all material storage piles, and all material handling operations specified in Appendix A has been implemented and is maintained. **(R 336.1371** 

#### IV. DESIGN/EQUIPMENT PARAMETERS

1. The permittee shall not operate the cement silos, the weightbatcher, nor the discharge chute portions of FG-PLANT unless the cartridge pulse central dust collector is installed, maintained, and operated in a satisfactory manner. (R 336.1910, 40 CFR 52.21(c) and (d))

#### V. TESTING/SAMPLING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

## VI. MONITORING/RECORDKEEPING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

- 1. The permittee shall complete all required calculations in a format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor by the 15th day of the calendar month, for the previous calendar month, unless otherwise specified in any monitoring/recordkeeping special condition. (40 CFR 52.21 (c) & (d))
- 2. The permittee shall keep monthly records of the cubic yards of concrete produced in FG-PLANT. Further the permittee shall calculate on a monthly basis, the yearly cubic yards of concrete produced based upon the most recent 12-month rolling time period. The permittee shall keep records of the amount of material processed on file and make them available to the Department upon request. **(40 CFR 52.21 (c) & (d))**

#### APPENDIX A: Nuisance Minimization Plan for Fugitive Dust

#### I. Site Roadways / Plant Yard

- A. The dust on the site roadways and the plant yard shall be controlled by applications of water, calcium chloride or other acceptable and approved fugitive dust control compounds. Applications of dust suppressants shall be done as often as necessary to meet all applicable emission limits. A record of all watering/dust suppressant applications and sweepings shall be kept on file and be made available to the AQD upon request.
- B. All paved roadways and plant yards shall be swept as needed between applications.
- C. Any material spillage on roads shall be cleaned up immediately.

## II. Plant

The drop distance at each transfer point shall be reduced to the minimum the equipment can achieve.

## III. Storage Piles

- A. Stockpiling of all materials shall be performed to minimize drop distance and control potential dust problems.
- B. Stockpiles shall be watered on an as needed basis in order to meet the opacity limit of 5 percent. Equipment to apply water or dust suppressant shall be available at the site. A record of all watering/dust suppressant applications shall be kept on file and be made available to the AQD upon request.

### IV. Truck Traffic

On-site vehicles shall be loaded to prevent their contents from dropping, leaking, blowing or otherwise escaping. This shall be accomplished by loading so that no part of the load shall come in contact within 6 inches of the top of any side board, side panel or tailgate. Otherwise, the truck shall be tarped.

## V. AQD/MDEQ Inspection

The provisions and procedures of this plan are subject to adjustment by written notification from the AQD if, following an inspection, the AQD finds the fugitive dust requirements and/or permitted emission limits are not being met.
