DEADLINE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON A PROPOSED REMEDIAL ACTION PLAN FOR THE FORMER ITT AUTOMOTIVE FACILITY, ROCHESTER, OAKLAND COUNTY. Written comments are being accepted on a proposed remedial plan for the former ITT Automotive facility, a site of environmental contamination located at 301 East Third Street, Rochester. The site is currently occupied by the Western Knitting Mills redevelopment project. The proposed plan calls for treatment of the groundwater impacting the Paint Creek by a permeable reactive wall to chemically neutralize the contaminants of concern. The plan also includes a monitoring plan for the groundwater to verify compliance with applicable criteria. The plan proposes restrictions on groundwater to prohibit use for drinking water, both on the site and on other properties potentially affected, and surface barriers of soil cover, pavement, or buildings to prevent direct contact exposure to contaminated soils.
