- State / Local Government
- Environmental agencies
- Emergency response
- Road commission
- Neighbors

# Understand Details & Goals Of The Removal Project - "WHAT"

- Full or partial cleanup
- Tonnage / mix of tires to be removed
- Markets / end use possibilities
- Recycling requirements
- Transportation considerations
- Labor needs / requirements
- Accessibility issues
- Weather issues, seasonal impact

# Cleanup Action Plan - "HOW"

- Define perimeter of project property
- Create access to the site



# Cleanup Action Plan - "HOW"

- Site preparation
- Establish system of documentation & tracking
- Follow agreed upon removal plan



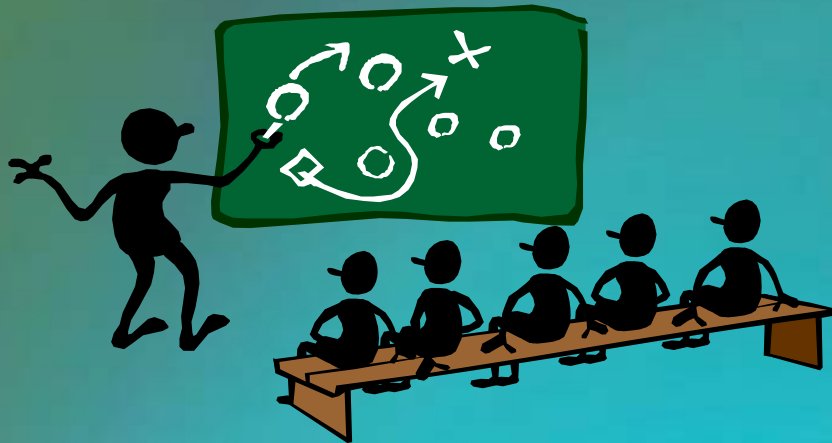
# Cleanup Action Plan - "HOW"

- It's all about the equipment



# Cleanup Action Plan - "How"

- Provide consistent health, safety & emergency response training



- Always keep the site well organized and free of trash & clutter

# Cleanup Action Plan - "How"

- Communicate progress / problems with those who have a stake in the project
- Limit access of casual observers to site



# Project Completion

- Ensure all documentation is accurate & complete
- Hand pick remaining tire pieces and grade area to leave site in excellent condition
- Confirm that all participants are satisfied with the final results of the project
- Celebrate
