**DO I NEED AN AIR PERMIT?: AN INTRODUCTION TO MICHIGAN AIR PERMITTING, VARIOUS LOCATIONS, MICHIGAN.** Do You Need an Air Permit? If you don't know, then this workshop is for you! Any business or institution that emits an air contaminant (e.g., particulate matter, sulfur dioxide, volatile organic compounds, and carbon monoxide) outside or inside of a building may be required to obtain an air permit from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). Not having an air permit when one is required may result in significant fines and penalties. This workshop is designed to help you determine whether or not an air permit is required for the potential air polluting processes (e.g. boilers, welding stations, and material handling, coating, grinding and degreasing operations) at your facility.
