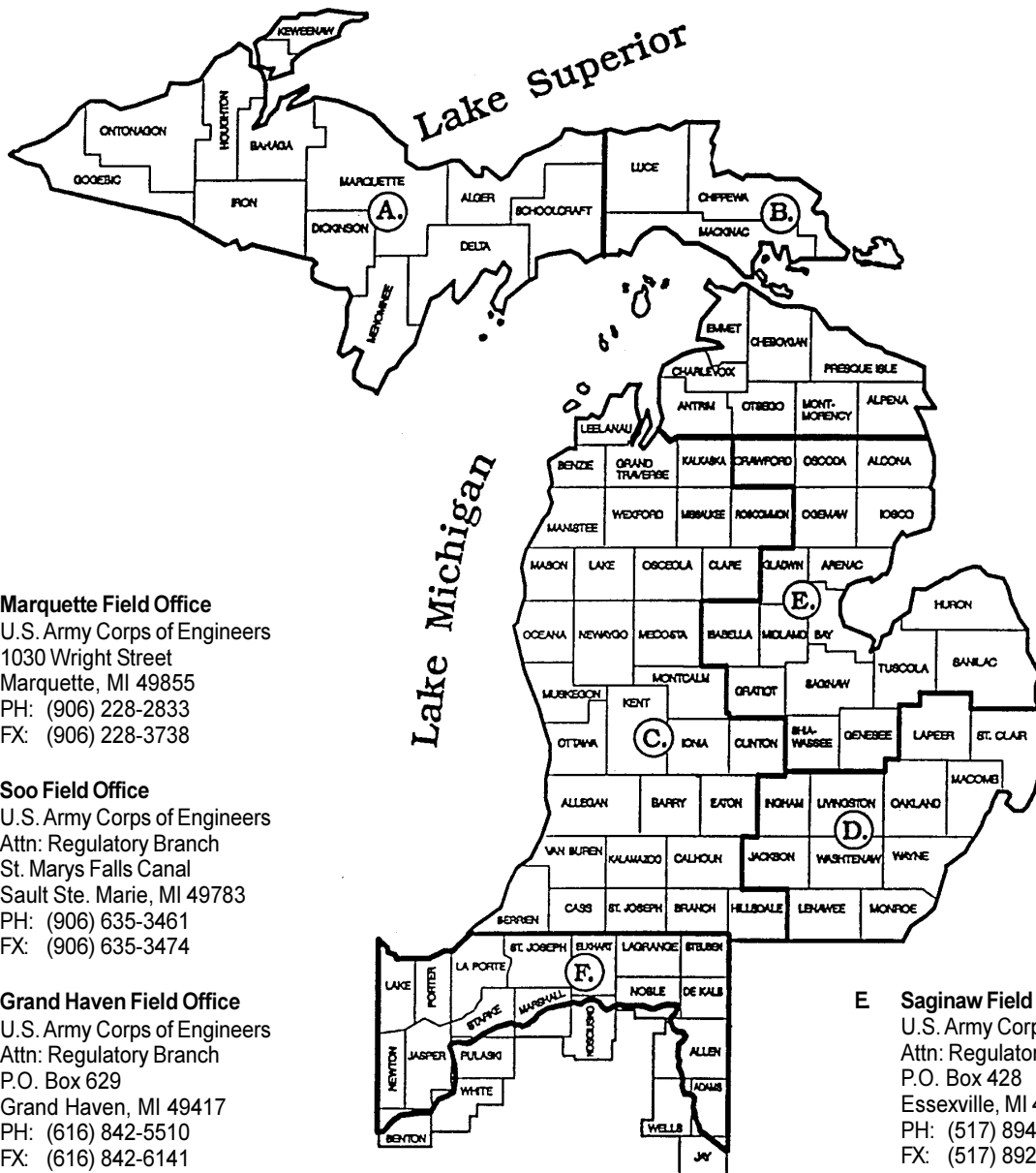


# Federal Agencies Involved in Wetland Protection and Management

Under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and pursuant regulations, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is authorized to issue permits for the discharge of dredged or fill material in waters of the United States, including wetlands. Upon request, the Corps will send public notices of projects to interested landowners.

The US EPA has oversight of the Clean Water Act Section 404 wetlands program and establishes regional wetlands policies. The Agency works to protect the chemical, physical, and biological integrity of waters of the United States, including wetlands. 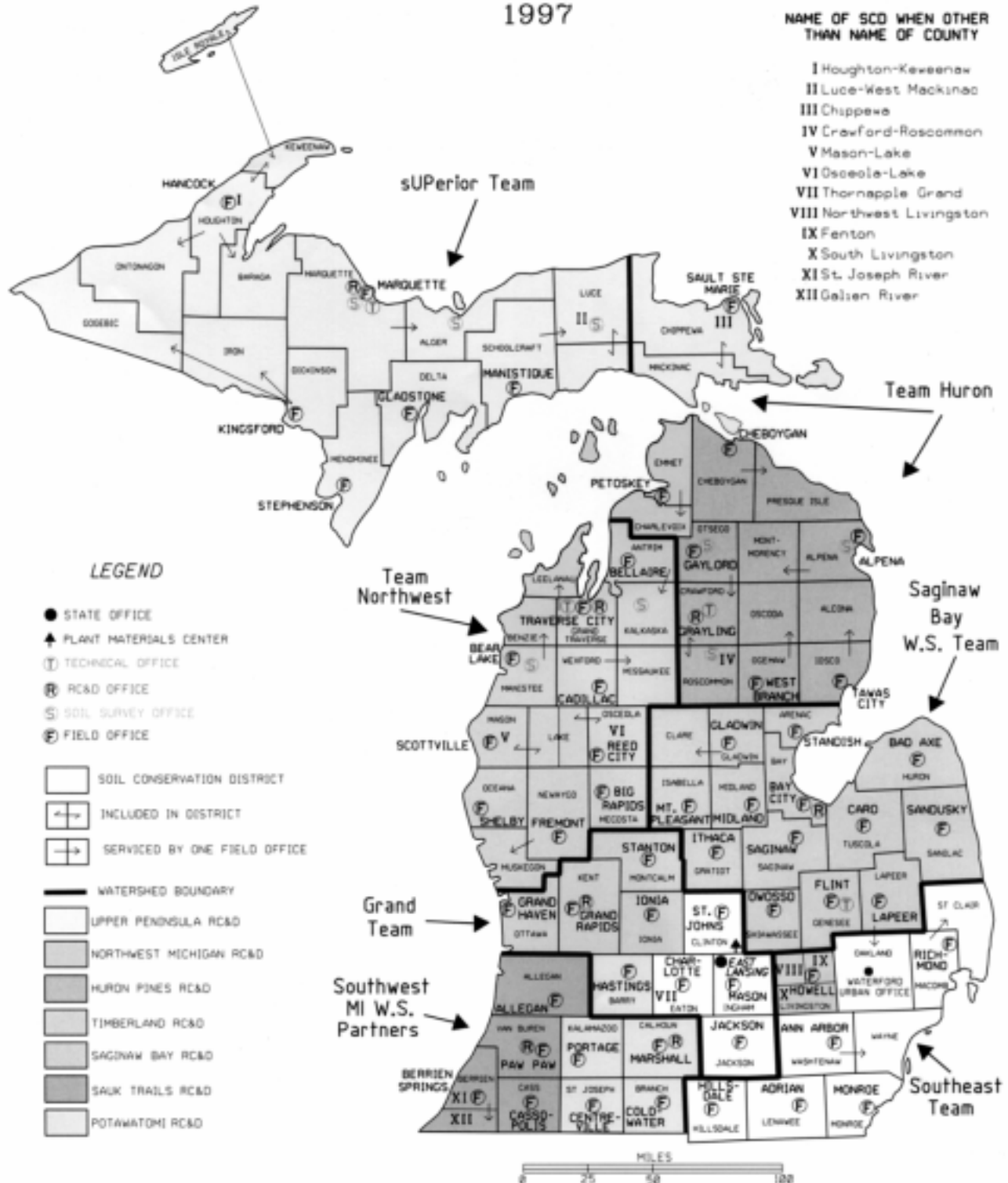
