

Where to get info to prepare for the Level 5 exam:

1. The Noncommunity Drinking Water Program Web Page

Surf around the links for information regarding the Type II (noncommunity) public drinking water program. This info relates to your type of facility. The Type II regulations are adopted from the Safe Drinking Water Act which is a federal law. The exam questions are based on the Safe Drinking Water Act and Michigan's regulations regarding Type II facilities.

Sampling fact sheets and brochures from this site are good references to review.
