At 10:00 A.M. on September 7, 2017, Air Quality Division staff Dave Morgan conducted an unannounced inspection of Conway-Cleveland Corporation located at 2320 Oak Industrial Drive NE in Grand Rapids. The purpose of the inspection was to determine the facility's compliance with state and federal air pollution regulations as well as Permit to Install (PTI) No. 988-91. Accompanying AQD staff on the inspection was Scott Knutson, President.

FACILITY DESCRIPTION

Conway-Cleveland manufacturers wooden lumber scaling rules used to measure the board feet content of sawn lumber. The company has various woodworking machines with an associated baghouse. The company also has a wood-burning furnace permitted under PTI No. 988-91.

COMPLIANCE EVALUATION

The company has a Cresswood model woodburning furnace. This unit was installed in 1991 and appeared to be installed as designed and as applied for in the original application for PTI No. 988-91. According to Mr. Knutson, this process is used in the winter to provide supplemental space heating in the winter. Scrap, air-dried hickory generated on site is used in the furnace. No compliance issues were identified with this unit.

The company has 11 woodworking stations that vent to a baghouse. The baghouse is exhausted back into the building. Collected wood particles are sent off-site for animal bedding. The woodworking and associated baghouse are exempt from air use permitting under Michigan Air Pollution Control Rule 285(2)(l)(vi).

No visible emissions were observed around the baghouse.
