VIOLATION NOTICE

On January 4, 2018, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted an inspection of Anrod Screen Cylinder Co. located at 6160 Garfield Avenue, Cass City, Michigan. The purpose of this inspection was to determine Anrod Screen Cylinder Co.'s compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); the Air Pollution Control Rules.

During the inspection, staff observed the following:

This process is subject to the federal National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for Halogenated Solvent Cleaning. These standards are found in 40 CFR Part 63, Subpart T.

During this inspection, it was noted that Anrod Screen Cylinder Co. had installed and commenced operation of an unpermitted process at this facility. The AQD staff advised Anrod Screen Cylinder Co. on January 30, 2018, that this is a violation of Act 451, Rule 201.

A program for compliance may include a completed PTI application for the Bulk Vapor Degreaser process equipment. An application form is available by request, or at the following website: www.michigan.gov/deqair (in the shaded box on the upper right hand side of the page)

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Be advised that Rule 201 requires that a permit be obtained prior to installation, construction, operation, reconstruction, relocation, or alteration of any process or process equipment which may be a source of an air contaminant.

Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violations and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by February 21, 2018 (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the violations occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violations; whether the violations are ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violations and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

If Anrod Screen Cylinder Co. believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.

Thank you for your attention to resolving the violations cited above and for the cooperation that was extended to me during my inspection of Anrod Screen Cylinder Co.
