Dear Ms. Radulski,

Please find this letter in response to the "Notice of Violation" we received on August 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2014, regarding the Grand Canyon Compressor vent stack restrictions.

Arbor Operating, LLC has provided a summary of the events explaining the cause of the violation and the action taken to repair conditions, in this correspondence.

VIOLATION; The stack has a curved section at top of exhaust pipe preventing an unobstructed vertical exhaust of emissions.

Arbor Operating, LLC (Arbor) acquired the Grand Canyon CPF in late 2012 from Rampart Energy. Rampart Energy applied for and received a permit to install a Cat 398 NA engine for the compressor on location on October 6, 2011. The stack vent that is in violation was installed with the curved section at top of stack upon initial installation of compressor/engine by Rampart Energy.

Arbor has not made any changes to stack or engine since that installation, and made the assumption that all equipment was in compliance.

Upon the receipt of "Notice of Violation" Arbor contracted a service company to remove the "curved section" off the top of stack on September 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2014. Stack will remain unobstructed at all times moving forward.
