VIOLATION NOTICE

On August 23, 2017, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted an inspection of A-1 Auto Salvage & Scrap (Company) located at 2574 State Street, Ypsilanti. The purpose of this inspection was to determine the Company's compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451) and the associated Air Pollution Control Rules.
