RENEWABLE OPERATING PERMIT
NOTICE OF AIR POLLUTION PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

The Department of Natural Resources and Environment is holding a public comment period until June 23, 2011, on the draft renewal of Phase II Acid Rain Permit (permit No. MI-AR-1745-20XX) under consideration to be issued to Detroit Edison Trenton Channel Power Plant located at 4695 W. Jefferson Ave. in Trenton, Michigan. The facility's Responsible Official is Mr. Paul Fessler, Vice President - Fossil Generation.

Electric utility plants that have an output capacity of 25 megawatts or greater are required to obtain and operate in compliance with a Phase II Acid Rain Permit pursuant to Title IV of the Federal Clean Air Act. The Acid Rain Permit is intended to achieve environmental benefits through reductions in sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxide emissions. This permit is intended to facilitate active trading of allowances and use of other compliance options to minimize compliance costs; maximize economic efficiency, and permit strong economic growth; and promote pollution prevention and energy efficient strategies and technologies.

All persons are encouraged to present their views on the draft permit. Persons wishing to comment or request a public hearing should submit written statements by June 23, 2011 to the attention of Brian Carley at the District Office referenced above. The decision maker for the permit is Mr. Christopher Ethridge, Acting Southeast Michigan District Supervisor.

If requested in writing by June 23, 2011, a public hearing may be scheduled.

Comments will also be accepted at the public hearing, if held. Persons needing accommodations for effective participation at the public hearing, if held, should contact Brian Carley at the District Office referenced above a week in advance to request mobility, visual, hearing, or other assistance.
