On September 26, 2014 AQD Staff (Matt Deskins) went to conduct an unannounced scheduled inspection of the Colortek facility located in Baroda, Berrien County. According to district file records Colortek is a minor source and they have a general air permit (PTI No. 266-02) issued to them by the AQD for 2 coating lines and a spray booth. The intent of staff's inspection was to determine the facilities compliance with their permit and any other state and/or federal air regulations. Staff departed for the facility at approximately 9:10 a.m.

Staff arrived at the address for the Colortek facility at approximately 10:30 a.m. Staff noted that the sign out front said D.A. D'Agostino Custom Excavating and Trucking. Staff looked at the stacks coming out the roof of the facility and didn't note any visible emissions but it also didn't seem like anything was being operated. Staff then proceeded down the driveway to the office area. Staff entered the office area and introduced them self to the office manager (Jade Smith). Staff mentioned the purpose of the visit and asked if she knew anything about Colortek. Jade mentioned that Colortek went out of business approximately 2 years ago and that D'Agostino bought and has occupied the building for about a year. Staff then asked if the painting equipment was still there or if it had been removed? She said that the equipment was still there but that they don't use it. She said that they just use the building for their offices and for storing their trucks and heavy equipment. Staff then asked if they could take a look at the painting equipment but Jade didn't feel comfortable with that since the owner wasn't around. Staff then gave her their business card and asked if she would have the owner (Woody D'Agostino) call me. She said she would. Staff thanked her for her time and departed the facility at approximately 11:00 a.m.

On September 30, 2014 staff called and left a message for Woody in which they asked him to call them when he got the chance. That same day Woody returned staff's call. Staff explained to Woody that they had been out at their office location the previous Friday to inspect the Colortek facility which is no longer there. Staff went on to explain that the Colortek facility had an air permit with the AQD for their painting operations and that if the equipment is still there, the permit would have to remain active unless the equipment is removed or rendered inoperable. Woody said that the equipment isn't used and that they have plans to dismantle everything including the stacks, but he wasn't sure when that would get done. Staff then told him that he had given Jade a business card and to either call or send staff a letter to let them know when everything is dismantled so we could void out the permit. He said that he would. Staff also reminded him that should any of the painting equipment be used in the meantime, they have to meet the requirements of the air permit and that we can still inspect them. He said he understood. Staff thanked Woody for returning their call.

Inspection Summary: Not Operating. Staff will have the file name changed to reflect the new occupants/owners of the facility (D.A. D'Agostino Custom Excavating and Trucking) and will mark the operational status in the AQD database as "Temporarily Closed". The facility will remain in inspection targeting until such time the permit can be voided.
