I arrived at the facility and met with Aaron Scrivens. I told him the purpose of my visit and gave him the Environmental Inspections pamphlet, which I went over with him. This is a concrete batch plant that is currently operating under PTI #196-99. He showed me that they processed 48,003 yards of concrete last year, which is well under their limit of 100,000 cubic yards in Special Condition #1. Per their MAERS submittal, they emitted 196 pounds of PM10 which is well under their limit 9.9 tons per calendar year. Also according to their MAERS submittal, they operated approximately 2,400 hours last year which means that they averaged 0.0817 pounds per hour. This is also well under their limit of 2.25 lbs/hr. Based on these numbers, they are in compliance with S.C. 2 of their permit.

I did not see any visible emissions that exceeded 10% opacity at the concrete batch plant, nor 5% opacity caused by truck traffic nd/loader traffic or by material storage piles (per S.C. 3, 4 and 5). The dust collector for the truck loading operation is being operated properly (per S.C. 6). They had recently watered their traffic areas before I arrived at the plant unannounced. They are maintaining a program to control fugitive dust emissions for all plant roadways, the plant yard, and all other areas as required in S.C. 7. He stated that they do not use any raw materials that contain asbestos tailing or asbestos containing waste materials which is in compliance with S.C. 8. I determined that they are meeting the conditions of their permit. I thanked him for his time and left.

Based on the information gathered during my inspection and their MAERS submittal, I determined that they are in compliance.
