VIOLATION NOTICE

On June 18, 2015 and September 16, 2015, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted inspections of Shook Asphalt Company, Inc. located at 8281 Snows Lake Road, Greenville, Michigan. The purpose of the inspections was to determine Shook Asphalt Company, Inc.'s compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); the administrative rules; and the conditions of Permit to Install (PTI) number 37-05A.

During the inspections, staff observed the following:

| EUHMAPLANT | PTI No. 37-05A, Special Condition (SC) 1.16 | Failure to monitor CO at the start of paving season. |
| EUHAMPLANT | PTI No. 37-05A, SC 1.24 | Failure to maintain records for CO emission monitoring. |
| EUHMAPLANT | PTI No. 37-05A, SC 1.18 | Failure to calibrate, maintain and operate a device to monitor pressure drop across the fabric filter dust collector. |
| EUHMAPLANT | PTI No. 37-05A, SC 1.21; Appendix B 1.b | Failure to measure the pressure drop across fabric filter dust collector at least once per day. |
| EUHMAPLANT | PTI No. 37-05A, SC 1.21; Appendix B 6 | Failure to conduct a black light test at least once per year. |

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Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violations and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by October 16, 2015 (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the violations occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violations; whether the violations are ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violations and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a recurrence.

If Shook Asphalt Company, Inc. believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.

Thank you for your attention to resolving the violations cited above and for the cooperation that was extended to me during my inspection of Shook Asphalt Company, Inc.
