

Dear Mr. Conklin:

On January 10, 2020 Peninsula Powder Coating had an inspection completed by EGLE.

Peninsula Powder Coating received notice on January 23<sup>rd</sup> via email and then around January 28<sup>th</sup> via mail that the wastewater evaporator and shot blasting process were not in compliance.

The wastewater evaporator was found not to have an installation permit (R 336.1201). The baghouse that supports the shot blasting operation process was found to release fugitive dust into the air while emptying the waste material from the baghouse hopper (R 336.1370).

The wastewater evaporator is currently not in compliance, Peninsula Powder Coating will submit the application on or before Feb. 19<sup>th</sup> 2020.

The shotblast process is also still not in compliance. We are awaiting ordered parts to remediate the fugitive dust issue. The project will be completed by Feb. 28<sup>th</sup> 2020. Peninsula Powder Coating does not expect to empty the waste material from the hopper before Feb. 28<sup>th</sup>.
