Dear Dan McGee,

Per the violation regarding the VOC limits for Elite Cleanroom Services we have been working with Brittany at Alliance Consultants to get our permit limit up for VOC's. We are currently in the permit process and are waiting to hear from Brittany for an update on our permit increase.

The alleged violation of the 10.7 TPY VOC limit specified in Permit to Install 101-13B took place because it was not possible from a practical standpoint to prove the assumption used when the plant was originally being permitted that 55% of the VOC from the raw materials would end up in the wastewater and not be released to the ambient air.

Because it would be burdensome to have a revised permit require ongoing testing of wastewater with recordkeeping to prove the actual amount of VOC captured in the wastewater treatment process, Elite Cleanroom Services has decided to seek an increase in the overall amount of VOC emissions allowed. We recognize that actual VOC emissions from the plant may be somewhat less than the estimated amount, due to some being captured during wastewater treatment. We have been working with a consultant and Air Quality Division's Permit Section to prepare a permit application for the proposed VOC increase. The application will be submitted as quickly as possible.
