

NOTICE of AIR PERMIT COMMENT PERIOD

The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) is holding a public comment period and a virtual public hearing, if requested, to allow the public the opportunity to comment on the proposed conditional approval of a general air permit to install.

The public comment period is open from August 20, 2026, until September 28, 2026, with a virtual public hearing, if requested, on September 24, 2026, for:



What is open for comment: Portable Hot Mix Asphalt Plant General Permit

A proposed general Permit to Install (general PTI) to allow the installation, operation, and relocation of a portable hot mix asphalt plant.

Technical details:

The public comment period and, if requested, virtual public hearing are to allow all interested parties the opportunity to comment on the proposed conditional approval of a general PTI for a portable hot mix asphalt plant. A general PTI is a streamlined, simpler permitting option available when a project meets specific requirements.
