The following air permits are pending decision:

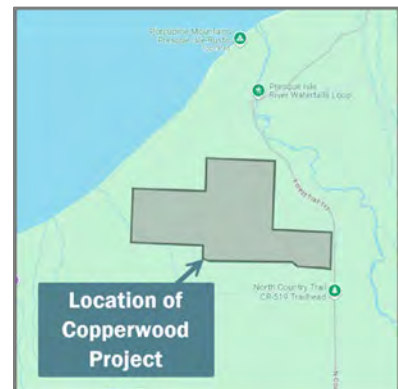

Document	Description
Proposed Project Summary	Provides a brief overview of the proposed project.
Technical Fact Sheet	Includes the technical evaluation of the permit application and how the proposed project meets the regulations that apply.
Notice of Hearing	Legal notice for the comment period.
Proposed Permit Terms and Conditions	Includes the proposed permit requirements based on a thorough review of the application.
Interested Party Letter	People who have indicated their interest in this facility are notified the comment period has started.
Company Letter	Informs the company the public comment period has started.
