Dear Interested Party:

We are sending you this information because you may have an interest in air quality activities near you. Marathon Petroleum Company LP (Marathon) located at 1001 South Oakwood Boulevard in Detroit, Michigan, has requested several changes to their air permit. Marathon refers to these requests as the Detroit Permitting Project.

The Detroit Permitting Project includes applications from Marathon and two other companies that operate at the Marathon Detroit Refinery. These are Air Products and Chemicals, Inc. (Air Products) located at 1025 South Oakwood Boulevard in Detroit, Michigan, and MPLX Terminals LLC (MPLX) located at 12700 Toronto Street in Detroit, Michigan. All three companies were required to submit air permit applications (Marathon APP-2024-0053, Air Products APP-2024-0055, and MPLX APP-2024-0054). The applications are requests to:

- Remove some storage tank throughput limits (how much material can pass through the tank) and increase the number of coker drum cycles at Marathon so the refinery can operate at its physical capacity.
- Add new, voluntary, air pollutant emission limits (amount of a pollutant allowed to be released) for equipment at Marathon and Air Products affected by the removal of the throughput limits.
- Implement voluntary pollution control projects at Marathon to reduce air pollution releases from the refinery.
- Extend the perimeter air monitoring program at the facility for three years. If the new PTI is approved, the extended monitoring will be required.
- To increase the height of the vapor recovery unit stack at MPLX from 20 feet to 35 feet.

The law requires us to provide the proposed air permits for the public to comment on. Public comments are a very important part of making sure the applications have been thoroughly reviewed and often have positive impacts on the final permit decision.

Information about the air permit applications, such as a summary of the proposed project, the proposed permit conditions, and the technical fact sheet containing the regulatory analysis of the applications are available for you to review. This information, as well as what we can consider in our decision, may be found at Michigan gov/EGL FAirPublicNotice and select "Applications Open for Comment" or you
