GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))
- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909-7760, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to Rule 210 (R 336.1210), operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The terms and conditions of this Permit to Install shall apply to any person or legal entity that now or hereafter owns or operates the process or process equipment at the location authorized by this Permit to Install. If the new owner or operator submits a written request to the Department pursuant to Rule 219 and the Department approves the request, this permit will be amended to reflect the change of ownership or operational control. The request must include all of the information required by subrules (1)(a), (b), and (c) of Rule 219 and shall be sent to the District Supervisor, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal conditions or malfunction has been corrected, or within 30 days of discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). (R 336.1912)
- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law.
- Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.

- 11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of Rule 301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with Rule 303 (R 336.1303). (R 336.1301)
 - a) A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
 - b) A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
 - c) A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this Permit to Install.
- 12. Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in Rule 370(2). (R 336.1370)
- 13. The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with Rule 1001 and Rule 1003, under any of the conditions listed in Rule 1001. (R 336.2001)

"Expandable polystyrene beads" means certain polymeric materials containing an easily volatilized organic material, but does not include reground or recycled foam plastic material. These expandable polystyrene beads can be partially expanded by treatment with steam and subsequently processed and molded into rigid foam finished goods.

"ARCEL beads" means a type of expandable polystyrene beads composed of a copolymer of styrene and ethylene and marketed under the brand name ARCEL®.

"EPS beads" means expandable polystyrene beads other than ARCEL beads.

DESCRIPTION

The expandable polystyrene foam processes include finished goods storage and all the steps taken to create finished goods from expandable polystyrene beads. Major steps include partially expanding polystyrene beads with steam in the two Hirsch 6000 pre-expanders, pre-puff storage, and molding the pre-puff into finished goods.

1. The permittee shall, if requested by the AQD District Supervisor, determine the VOC content, as received, of each lot of EPS and ARCEL beads used in EUEPSPROCESS, using a method approved by the AQD District Supervisor. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))

VI. MONITORING/RECORDKEEPING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

- The permittee shall complete all required calculations in a format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor and make them available by the 15th day of the calendar month, for the previous calendar month, unless otherwise specified in any monitoring/recordkeeping special condition. (R 336.1205, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 2. The permittee shall monitor the daily throughput of EPS and ARCEL beads at pre-expansion in EUEPSPROCESS. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 3. The permittee shall keep a written record for each calendar day and month of the throughput at pre-expansion in EUEPSPROCESS for each lot number of EPS and ARCEL beads processed. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 4. The permittee shall keep a written record of all VOC content determinations on file for each lot of EPS and ARCEL beads used in EUEPSPROCESS. The vendor's certificate of analysis shall be acceptable for the purpose of determining the VOC content of a lot unless the District Supervisor requires an alternate VOC content determination pursuant to SC V.1. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))

- 5. The permittee shall keep a record of the VOC content (in pounds of VOC per 100 pounds of EPS and ARCEL beads as received) for each portion of each lot of EPS and ARCEL beads processed in EUEPSPROCESS. The vendor's certificate of analysis shall be acceptable for the purpose of determining the VOC content of a lot unless the District Supervisor requires an alternate VOC content determination pursuant to SC V.1. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 6. The permittee shall calculate and keep a record for each calendar month of the average VOC content in pounds of VOC per 100 pounds of EPS and ARCEL beads used at pre-expansion and of the actual VOC emissions from the processes (based on throughput at pre-expansion), using the method detailed in Appendix A. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1205, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 7. The permittee shall calculate the VOC emission rate from EUEPSPROCESS monthly, for the preceding 12-month rolling time period, using a method acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. The permittee shall keep all records on file at the facility and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1702(a))

II. For each lot of expandable polystyrene bead (i) used in the processes, the VOC emission for the specified time period shall be calculated as follows:
