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GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))
- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909-7760, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to Rule 210 (R 336.1210), operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The terms and conditions of this Permit to Install shall apply to any person or legal entity that now or hereafter owns or operates the process or process equipment at the location authorized by this Permit to Install. If the new owner or operator submits a written request to the Department pursuant to Rule 219 and the Department approves the request, this permit will be amended to reflect the change of ownership or operational control. The request must include all of the information required by subrules (1)(a), (b), and (c) of Rule 219 and shall be sent to the District Supervisor, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal conditions or malfunction has been corrected, or within 30 days of discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). (R 336.1912)
- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law.
- 10. Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.

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- 11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of Rule 301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with Rule 303 (R 336.1303). (R 336.1301)
 - a) A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
 - b) A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
 - c) A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this Permit to Install.
- 12. Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in Rule 370(2). (R 336.1370)
- 13. The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with Rule 1001 and Rule 1003, under any of the conditions listed in Rule 1001. (R 336.2001)

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- 2. The permittee shall maintain a current listing from the manufacturer of the chemical composition of each solvent, including the weight percent of each component. The data may consist of Safety Data Sheets, manufacturer's formulation data, or both as deemed acceptable by the AQD District Supervisor. The permittee shall keep all records and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1702)
- 3. The permittee shall keep the following information on a monthly basis for EUP5Wipe:
 - a) Gallons of each solvent used and reclaimed.
 - b) VOC content, in pounds per gallon, of each solvent used.
 - c) VOC mass emission calculations determining the monthly emission rate in tons per calendar month.
 - d) VOC mass emission calculations determining the annual emission rate in tons per 12-month rolling time period as determined at the end of each calendar month.

The permittee shall keep the records using mass balance, or an alternative method and format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. The permittee shall keep all records on file and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1702)

III. PROCESS/OPERATIONAL RESTRICTION(S)

- The permittee shall capture all waste coatings, thinners, reducers, purge and cleanup solvents, etc. (materials) and shall store them in closed containers. The permittee shall dispose of all waste materials in an acceptable manner in compliance with all applicable state rules and federal regulations. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 2. The permittee shall dispose of spent filters in a manner which minimizes the introduction of air contaminants to the outer air. (R 336.1224, R 336.1370(1))
- 3. The permittee shall handle all VOC and/or HAP containing materials, in a manner to minimize the generation of fugitive emissions. The permittee shall keep containers covered at all times except when operator access is necessary. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a))
- 4. Within 180 days from commencement of trial operation of PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and PaintSmall portions of EUCoating the permittee shall submit, implement, and maintain a malfunction abatement plan (MAP) as described in Rule 911(2). The MAP shall, at a minimum, specify the following
 - a) A complete preventative maintenance program including identification of the supervisory personnel responsible for overseeing the inspection, maintenance, and repair of air-cleaning devices, a description

- of the items or conditions that shall be inspected, the frequency of the inspections or repairs, and an identification of the major replacement parts that shall be maintained in inventory for quick replacement.
- b) An identification of the source and air-cleaning device operating variables that shall be monitored to detect a malfunction or failure, the normal operating range of these variables, and a description of the method of monitoring or surveillance procedures.
- c) A description of the corrective procedures or operational changes that shall be taken in the event of a malfunction or failure to achieve compliance with the applicable emission limits.
- d) A description of the procedures to capture, handle, and dispose of all materials to minimize the generation of fugitive emissions per SC numbers III.1 and III.2.

If at any time the MAP fails to address or inadequately addresses an event that meets the characteristics of a malfunction, the permittee shall amend the MAP within 60 days after such an event occurs. The permittee shall also amend the MAP within 60 days, if new equipment is installed or upon request from the AQD District Supervisor. The permittee shall submit the MAP and any amendments to the MAP to the AQD District Supervisor for review and approval. If the AQD does not notify the permittee within 90 days of submittal, the MAP or amended MAP shall be considered approved. Until an amended plan is approved, the permittee shall implement corrective procedures or operational changes to achieve compliance with all applicable emission limits. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910, R 336.1911)

5. For PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and/or PaintSmall portions of EUCoating, the permittee shall either maintain a minimum of 0.007 inches of water pressure differential between each PTE and the adjacent area on a continuous basis or maintain a facial velocity of 200 feet per minute through each natural draft opening of the PTE on a continuous basis. (R 336.1225(1), R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)

IV. DESIGN/EQUIPMENT PARAMETER(S)

- 1. The permittee shall not operate each spray booth portion of EUCoating unless all respective exhaust filters are installed, maintained and operated in a satisfactory manner. (R 336.1224, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 2. The permittee shall not operate PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and/or PaintSmall portions of EUCoating unless the associated PTE are installed, maintained and operated in a satisfactory manner. Satisfactory operation of each PTE includes a minimum capture efficiency for each PTE with 100 percent (by weight). (R 336.1205, R 336.1225, R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)
- 3. The permittee shall equip and maintain each spray booth portion of EUCoating with HVLP or comparable technology with equivalent transfer efficiency. For HVLP applicators, the permittee shall keep test caps available for pressure testing. (R 336.1702(a))
- 4. The permittee shall not operate PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and/or PaintSmall portions of EUCoating unless each associated PTE is installed, maintained and operated in a satisfactory manner. Satisfactory operation requires the following:
 - a) The direction of the air flow must be into the enclosure at all times; and either
 - b) The average facial velocity of air through all-natural draft openings in the enclosure must be at least 200 feet per minute;
 - c) The pressure drop across the enclosure must be at least 0.007-inch H₂O.

(R 336.1225(1), R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)

5. The permittee shall install, calibrate, maintain and operate, in a satisfactory manner, a pressure differential interlock system to monitor the pressure differential between each respective PTE for the PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and/or PaintSmall portions of EUCoating and the adjacent area associated with each PTE on a continuous basis during operation of the PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and/or PaintSmall portions of EUCoating. The interlock system will not allow any spray coating operation in the PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and/or PaintSmall portions of EUCoating unless the respective pressure differential is at least 0.007 inches H₂O. (R 336.1225(1), R 336.1702(a), R 336.1910)

V. TESTING/SAMPLING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

- 1. The permittee shall determine the VOC content, water content and density of any coating, as applied and as received, using federal Reference Test Method 24. Upon prior written approval by the AQD District Supervisor, the permittee may determine the VOC content from manufacturer's formulation data. If the Method 24 and the formulation values should differ, the permittee shall use the Method 24 results to determine compliance. (R 336.1225, R 336.1702, R 336.2003, R 336.2004, R 336.2040(5))
- 2. Within 180 days from commencement of trial operation of PaintWest, PaintEast, PaintMulti, and/or PaintSmall portions of EUCoating, the permittee shall verify the enclosure meets the definition of PTE or verify capture efficiency of the enclosure, by testing at owner's expense, in accordance with Department requirements. The permittee must complete the test once every five years, thereafter unless the permittee has submitted a demonstration that the most recent acceptable test remains valid and representative. Testing shall be performed using an approved EPA Method listed in 40 CFR Part 51, Appendix M.  - c) VOC, acetone, and methyl acetate mass emission calculations determining the monthly emission rate in tons per calendar month (for each subprocess of EUCoating and total combined for EUCoating).
 - d) VOC, acetone, and methyl acetate mass emission calculations determining the annual emission rate in tons per 12-month rolling time period as determined at the end of each calendar month (for each subprocess of EUCoating and total combined for EUCoating).

The permittee shall keep the records using mass balance, or an alternative method and format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. The permittee shall keep all records on file and make them available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1702(a))

4. Each semiannual compliance report shall identify which coating operation(s) used each compliance option, and if there were no deviations from the emission limitations in 40 CFR 63.4490, include a statement that the coating operations were in compliance. (40 CFR 63.4520, 40 CFR 63.4542(c), 40 CFR 63.4552(c), 40 CFR 63.4563(f))

VIII. STACK/VENT RESTRICTION(S)

IX. OTHER REQUIREMENT(S)

1. The permittee shall comply with all applicable provisions of the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants, as specified in 40 CFR Part 63, Subpart A and Subpart PPPP for Surface Coating of Plastic Parts and Products by the initial compliance date. (40 CFR Part 63, Subparts A and PPPP)
