GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The process or process equipment covered by this permit shall not be reconstructed, relocated, or modified, unless a Permit to Install authorizing such action is issued by the Department, except to the extent such action is exempt from the Permit to Install requirements by any applicable rule. (R 336.1201(1))
- 2. If the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment for which this permit has been approved has not commenced within 18 months, or has been interrupted for 18 months, this permit shall become void unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Furthermore, the permittee or the designated authorized agent shall notify the Department via the Supervisor, Permit Section, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, P.O. Box 30260, Lansing, Michigan 48909-7760, if it is decided not to pursue the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification of the equipment allowed by this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(4))
- 3. If this Permit to Install is issued for a process or process equipment located at a stationary source that is not subject to the Renewable Operating Permit program requirements pursuant to Rule 210 (R 336.1210), operation of the process or process equipment is allowed by this permit if the equipment performs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Permit to Install. (R 336.1201(6)(b))
- 4. The Department may, after notice and opportunity for a hearing, revoke this Permit to Install if evidence indicates the process or process equipment is not performing in accordance with the terms and conditions of this permit or is violating the Department's rules or the Clean Air Act. (R 336.1201(8), Section 5510 of Act 451, PA 1994)
- 5. The terms and conditions of this Permit to Install shall apply to any person or legal entity that now or hereafter owns or operates the process or process equipment at the location authorized by this Permit to Install. If the new owner or operator submits a written request to the Department pursuant to Rule 219 and the Department approves the request, this permit will be amended to reflect the change of ownership or operational control. The request must include all of the information required by subrules (1)(a), (b), and (c) of Rule 219 and shall be sent to the District Supervisor, Air Quality Division, Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy. (R 336.1219)
- 6. Operation of this equipment shall not result in the emission of an air contaminant which causes injurious effects to human health or safety, animal life, plant life of significant economic value, or property, or which causes unreasonable interference with the comfortable enjoyment of life and property. (R 336.1901)
- 7. The permittee shall provide notice of an abnormal condition, start-up, shutdown, or malfunction that results in emissions of a hazardous or toxic air pollutant which continue for more than one hour in excess of any applicable standard or limitation, or emissions of any air contaminant continuing for more than two hours in excess of an applicable standard or limitation, as required in Rule 912, to the Department. The notice shall be provided not later than two business days after start-up, shutdown, or discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction. Written reports, if required, must be filed with the Department within 10 days after the start-up or shutdown occurred, within 10 days after the abnormal condition or malfunction has been corrected, or within 30 days of discovery of the abnormal condition or malfunction, whichever is first. The written reports shall include all of the information required in Rule 912(5). (R 336.1912)
- 8. Approval of this permit does not exempt the permittee from complying with any future applicable requirements which may be promulgated under Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended or the Federal Clean Air Act.
- 9. Approval of this permit does not obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits or approvals from other units of government as required by law.
- 10. Operation of this equipment may be subject to other requirements of Part 55 of 1994 PA 451, as amended and the rules promulgated thereunder.

- 11. Except as provided in subrules (2) and (3) or unless the special conditions of the Permit to Install include an alternate opacity limit established pursuant to subrule (4) of Rule 301, the permittee shall not cause or permit to be discharged into the outer air from a process or process equipment a visible emission of density greater than the most stringent of the following. The grading of visible emissions shall be determined in accordance with Rule 303 (R 336.1303). (R 336.1301)
 - a) A six-minute average of 20 percent opacity, except for one six-minute average per hour of not more than 27 percent opacity.
 - b) A visible emission limit specified by an applicable federal new source performance standard.
 - c) A visible emission limit specified as a condition of this Permit to Install.
- 12. Collected air contaminants shall be removed as necessary to maintain the equipment at the required operating efficiency. The collection and disposal of air contaminants shall be performed in a manner so as to minimize the introduction of contaminants to the outer air. Transport of collected air contaminants in Priority I and II areas requires the use of material handling methods specified in Rule 370(2). (R 336.1370)
- 13. The Department may require the permittee to conduct acceptable performance tests, at the permittee's expense, in accordance with Rule 1001 and Rule 1003, under any of the conditions listed in Rule 1001. (R 336.2001)

EU-BURNOFF2 EMISSION UNIT CONDITIONS

DESCRIPTION

Natural gas fired burn off oven for removing cured paints and coatings from metal parts by thermal decomposition in a primary chamber. Emissions from the burn off oven are controlled by a secondary chamber afterburner.

POLLUTION CONTROL EQUIPMENT

Secondary chamber (afterburner)

I. EMISSION LIMIT(S)

1. There shall be no visible emissions from EU-BURNOFF2. (R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)

II. MATERIAL LIMIT(S)

- 1. The permittee shall burn only natural gas in EU-BURNOFF2. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1702, 40 CFR 52.21(c) & (d))
- 2. The permittee shall not process any material in EU-BURNOFF2 other than cured paints, oil or grease on metal parts, racks and/or hangers.¹ (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)

III. PROCESS/OPERATIONAL RESTRICTION(S)

- 1. The permittee shall not use EU-BURNOFF2 for the thermal destruction or removal of rubber, plastics, uncured paints, or any other materials containing sulfur or halogens (chlorine, fluorine, bromine, etc.) such as plastisol, polyvinyl chloride (PVC), or Teflon.¹ (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)
- The permittee shall not load any transformer cores, which may be contaminated with PCB-containing dielectric fluid, wire or parts coated with lead or rubber, or any waste materials such as paint sludge or waste powder coatings into EU-BURNOFF2.¹ (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)
- 3. The permittee shall operate EU-BURNOFF2 according to the manufacturer's recommendations. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1702, R 336.1910)

IV. DESIGN/EQUIPMENT PARAMETER(S)

- The permittee shall not operate EU-BURNOFF2 unless a secondary chamber or afterburner is installed, maintained, and operated in a satisfactory manner. Satisfactory operation of the secondary chamber or afterburner includes maintaining a minimum temperature of 1400°F and a minimum retention time of 0.5 seconds. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1702, R 336.1910)
- 2. The permittee shall not operate EU-BURNOFF2 unless an automatic temperature control system for the primary chamber and secondary chamber or afterburner is installed, maintained, and operated in a satisfactory manner. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 3. The permittee shall not operate EU-BURNOFF2 unless an interlock system that shuts down the primary chamber burner in the event of a loss of flame in the secondary chamber afterburner, is installed, maintained and operated in a satisfactory manner. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)

V. TESTING/SAMPLING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

VI. MONITORING/RECORDKEEPING

Records shall be maintained on file for a period of five years. (R 336.1201(3))

- 1. The permittee shall install, calibrate, maintain and operate in a satisfactory manner a device to continuously monitor the temperature in the burn off oven secondary chamber or afterburner and record the temperature at least once every 15 minutes. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 2. The permittee shall calibrate the thermocouples associated with the primary and secondary chambers at least once per year. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1910)
- 3. The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, temperature data records for the burn off oven secondary chamber or afterburner. All records shall be kept on file for a period of at least five years and made available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225, R 336.1301, R 336.1910)
- 4. The permittee shall keep, in a satisfactory manner, records of the date, duration, and description of any malfunction of the control equipment, any maintenance performed and any testing results for EU-BURNOFF2. All records shall be kept on file for a period of at least five years and made available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1910, R 336.1912)
- 5. The permittee shall maintain a current listing from the manufacturer of the chemical composition of each material (cured coating, oil or grease) processed in EU-BURNOFF2, including the weight percent of each component. The data may consist of Material Safety Data Sheets, manufacturer's formulation data, or both. All records shall be kept on file for a period of at least five years and made available to the Department upon request.¹ (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)
- The permittee shall maintain current information from the manufacturer that EU-BURNOFF2 is equipped with a secondary chamber or afterburner, an automatic temperature control system for the primary chamber and secondary chamber or afterburner, and an interlock system that shuts down the primary chamber burner when the secondary chamber or afterburner is not operating properly. All records shall be kept on file for a period of at least five years and made available to the Department upon request. (R 336.1224, R 336.1225)

VII. <u>REPORTING</u>

1. Within 30 days after completion of the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification authorized by this Permit to Install, the permittee or the authorized agent pursuant to Rule 204, shall notify the AQD District Supervisor, in writing, of the completion of the activity. Completion of the installation, construction, reconstruction, relocation, or modification is considered to occur not later than commencement of trial operation of EU-BURNOFF2. (R 336.1201(7)(a))

VIII. STACK/VENT RESTRICTION(S)

The exhaust gases from the stacks listed in the table below shall be discharged unobstructed vertically upwards to the ambient air unless otherwise noted:

IX. OTHER REQUIREMENT(S)

1. Within 45 days following completion of installation, the permittee shall label EU-BURNOFF2, with a method acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor. Within seven days of completing the labeling, the permittee shall notify the AQD District Supervisor, in writing, as to the date the labeling was completed. **(R 336.1201)**
